## Roger Awad I-C Bat Winner Mound Honors To Bill Noble

Roger Awad classy shortstop for the pennant-winning Riverside Sports Shop club, has captured the Inter-City Fastball League's individual batting championship with .346 average.

He collected 28 hits in 81 trips to the plate to run away from all other players in the five-team circuit.

Essex Packers' first baseman Ted Zalba was the only other player in the League to top the coveted .300 mark. He hit .303 with 20 hits in 66 trips to the plate.

Awad rapped out the most doubles in the league, six, shared the runs batted in laurels with team-mate Doug Carley, each with 15, and tied for the most hits, 28, with Phil Abbott of Shirriff's Chips.

Bill Noble of Essex Packers nosed out Gary Nolan of Riverside Sports Shop for the top pitching honors.

**A:** Presence of active cancer, active HIV or active infection would absolutely rule-out donation. If a person has a history of Hepatitis, more information would need to be obtained at the time of death. Patients who have Hepatitis C may still donate organs to a patient who also has Hepatitis C. The same is true for Hepatitis B - but this happens less frequently.
